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14 kiosks can make it easier to pay city its due

Chicago residents can pay water-sewer bills, parking tickets and fines for red-light camera violations with cash, checks, credit cards or debit cards at any of 14 electronic kiosks.

The city has installed the stands to provide an option to make payment easier, city Revenue Director Bea Reyna-Hickey said Monday. Five of the kiosks, at O'Hare International Airport and four police stations, can be used 24 hours a day.

Since the first kiosk was installed about four months ago, the city has received more than 12,000 payments totaling more \$1 million, Reyna-Hickey said.

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The city compensates Pay-Ease, the company that owns the kiosks, 78 cents to 90 cents per transaction. Three more kiosks are on the way.
